THUMBS IN PRINT

The November issue of the NFFS digest features a dandy plan and commentary of Bill Gowen's A-6, which was also selected for a NFFS Model of the Year award in the 2011 sympo. Well done, Bill.

I continue my series of articles in *Free Flight Quarterly* on the models of our august and departed OFB George Perryman. The October issue has a fine article on his Coupes. Frankly, I'm pleased with it, as it was a joy to write. I probably cranked out the text in a couple of hours. Writing about George really isn't much of a chore. My memories of the man remain rich, a blessed gift, and I don't think I'm alone here. I think you'll find the Coupe article a good read, as many of us are familiar with the models and when and where he flew them.

Another article is forthcoming on his Dawn Unlimited models, probably to be contained in the April issue. The modest scrawling completed so far promises another good read. Like its predecessors, the graphical record is rich in detail. I suspect the international readership of FFQ

will find it fascinating. You see, as near as this investigator can tell, the Dawn Unlimited class is unique to these shores. Go figure. It seems like a natural to me. One single flight at dawn, *mano e mano*—who could resist? Apparently the rest of the globe can, if my limited awareness is any indication. Maybe George’s arcane obsession will inspire others. Stay tuned.

John Kagan’s column in the January issue of *Model Aviation* has a very nice write-up of TTOMA’s indoor activity and ample mention of the St. Luke’s flying site, along with a great photo. Maybe we’ll get some out-of-towners at the PSIC and PSRT.

2012 MODEL OF THE YEAR

We’ve elected to fly Earl Stahl scale models as the MOY in 2012, rather than a single design. Further, in order to encourage participation, we’ve secured approval from FAC GHQ to run this MOY for kanones under the following rules:

1. Any Earl Stahl scale model is eligible, all dates OK.
2. Rubber-power only, indoors or outdoors
3. Models must be built per the original plans, but scaling up or down allowed, max wingspan 36 in., projected. .
4. Provision for DT or blast tubes allowed, along SAM specs
5. Gears up OK, per FAC specs
6. Models will be flown as total of three flights or mass launch, CD’s choice, prior published notice required.
7. Event is eligible for kanones if enough flyers enter, per GHQ FAC; club high points per usual.

2012 EVENT OF THE YEAR

We decided to change the event of the year (EOY) from Embryo to Dime Scale. This is an official FAC class, eligible for kanones, and possibly the easiest, rubber-powered, scale model to build and fly. Plenty of indoor (single-surfaced) and outdoor designs await execution. Also, many of these are old timers, and high points lie in wait here, too. This is the best opportunity for Thumbs to get into the scale “bidness”, and we expect some good participation. FAC members in the club are aware of the Dime Scale rules. For the others, the new 2012-2013 rules follow, hot off the presses.

MORE KANONES, PLEASE

Let’s not forget the FAC’s new Phantom Flash class. I build one to replace Bob Baker’s old campaigner that went OOS on me last spring, and I flew mine indoors most of this year. Karl says he has one under construction as I peck. One or two more and we can fly it legitimately indoors and outdoors next year for kanones.

The design is a classic, penned by Comet’s redoubtable Joe Konefes before WW II, and guaranteed to fly as long you don’t do anything stupid or crazy. The plan can be downloaded numerous places for free and built in a long evening, surely one weekend.

The FAC rules specify a plastic prop and it must be built per the plan, so you can’t get too creative. Mine weighs a robust six grams and is still good for over one minute indoors. (Bob’s did twice that, BTW.) According to the rules, indoor flights must ROG, and outdoors you can hand launch. Fine print aficionados will note there is no max flight time, too. This could be fun. “Get tah yah whittlin’, y’all!”

HAIL TO THE CHIEF

We elected the 2012 officer slate during the November outdoor contest/meeting, per our by-laws. I should say we re-elected our officer slate because it offered nothing but the usual suspects. They are: David Barfield, president; Jim Altenbern, veep; Don Brown, treasurer; and Karl Hube, secretary.

As is my custom, I asked the assembled throng if anybody wanted to be newsletter editor and was met with stone silence. Therefore, I'll shoulder the yoke again. I think it's been thirty or thirty-one years so duly honored—I'll have to look it up. Jeez, it seems like only thirty or thirty-one years ago.

Annual TTOMA Turkey Shoot a Success

Under brilliant topaz blue skies with a dazzling display of ever-changing cirrus clouds, the third annual TTOMA Turkey Shoot was held at the sod farm on November 6. The day began with wind in the “maybe” range and the air temperature in the “three-layers” of clothes range.

As the day progressed, the winds died down; thermals became light and abundant; the drift was safely down the field; and it was T-shirt time by eleven.

Seven TTOMA stalwarts did battle all day. The Target Time event saw unlimited flights with the 39 second target within range of all of the contestant's chosen models. Bob Thoren, David Mills, and Dohrman Crawford ended in a tie at 38 seconds. There was a mass flyoff, with the target time of 39 seconds as the goal. Dohrman Crawford flew the closest to the target with a TLG and copped the \$25 Publix gift certificate.

In the MOY mass launch it was Mills versus Barfield in a battle of the Senator design. Mills took first place and a gift certificate with an easy 120 second max. Barfield's flight was a credible 65 seconds for second place.

In the Rubber Scale mass launch, there were four Thumbers vying for groceries. It was Mills' Lacey in first, Hube's Dime Scale Bristol Brownie in second, Barf's Zero in third, and Howard Klemmetsen's peanut Zero ditching on the Bermuda grass in fourth.

Mills showed that he was seriously shooting for the Thanksgiving table when he took a third \$25 gift certificate with an Embryo mass launch win over Barf and Dohrm.

The Catapult Glider tourney was interesting to say the least. It was flown in a double elimination format—two losses and the flyer was eliminated. All seven in attendance flew in the tourney. Names were drawn for seeding into the first matches. It took twelve matches to determine a winner with Barf going all the way through the loser's bracket with only one loss, knocking out all of the other contenders until he fought his way back into the finals with Mills who went through the winner's bracket without a loss. Barf would have to defeat Mills twice to win. It was not to be as Mills vanquished Barf on the first flight by a scant few seconds. Chalk up Mills' fourth prize of the day.

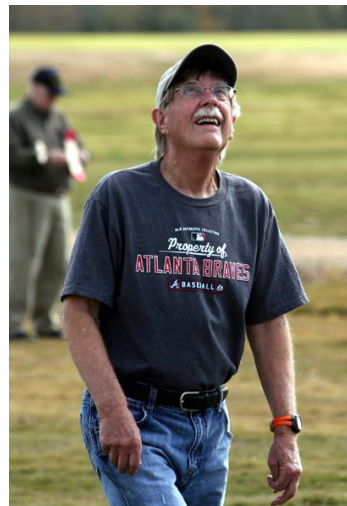
Longest D/T time to the ground was won by Barfield with his Senator with 15 seconds. In the "Fly the Coop", longest OOS flight, nobody could catch a thermal with an old beat up model and fly off the field. Bob Thoren tried ten times with an Old Time rubber model and a Thermal Piglet. Dohrm tried to catch a nice light thermal with a Hangar Rat, but the air spit the model out and down by the sod farm office. Bob Thoren was awarded the certificate more on effort than result, although Bob probably got closest to the main gate than anyone. Bob also won the closing drawing for the last \$25 gift certificate.

It was a great flying day filled with models of all colors fluorescing against a mile high sky. There was a lot of flying activity all day, lots of friendly competition, some smart tactical flying, great camaraderie, and many plans to attend the Turkey Shoot next year. If you missed it this year, you might want to reserve the first Sunday in November next year for your chance at fame, glory, and a big, fat turkey for the Thanksgiving table. Be ready to fly and have a ton of fun. I'll be seeing you downwind.

VII. DIME SCALE

Dime Scale models come in two flavors: **Traditional**, and **Pseudo**. Both compete under the same rules. Traditional Dimers are built from plans produced during the "golden age" of modeling; Pseudo Dimers are built from contemporary designs that honor the simplicity and methods of those early plans.

1.0 BASIC RULES

- A. Dime Scale models are to be of simple design and easy construction such as those built from 10 cent kits or plans representing full scale airplanes built prior to December 31, 1949.
- B. Wing span: 16 inches maximum.
- C. When a Pseudo plan is created, the plan size is limited to one sheet of 11 X 17 inch paper plus one 8.5 X 11 inch parts page with engineering and details in the spirit of the original era.
- D. Props must be one piece wood or molded plastic.
- E. Model and plan must be presented to the CD prior to first flight for "static judging" and awarding of bonus points as described below.

2.0 DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION

Combining Traditional and Pseudo dimers involves some unique considerations. "Traditional" Dimers must be built as per plan; however, contemporary construction modifications as listed below are permitted to ease construction and increase the model's fun factor.

- A. General construction:
 1. Minimum wood size:
 - a. Greater than 14" wingspan: 1/16" thick sheet or square sticks.
 - b. 14" or less wingspan: 1/32" thick sheet and 1/20" square sticks.
 - c. Stiff paper called for on some plans may be replaced by 1/32" sheet or stringers with tissue.
 2. Butt joints on plans, and landing gear struts may be reinforced with wire, sheet balsa or 1/32" ply.
 3. No use of foam.
 4. No vacuum formed or plunge molded parts EXCEPT canopies; SEE "Bonus Points."
- B. Fuselage:
 1. Pseudo Dimers must be engineered with box girder fuselage with formers.
 2. Nose on Traditional dimers may be altered to accommodate thrust bearing and removable nose plug.
 3. Rear motor peg may be located anywhere within fuselage or nacelles.
- C. Wings and tailfeathers:
 1. Wings may be one piece with spars added or moved. One piece stabs and rudders are permitted.
 2. Stab and rudder may be reduced or enlarged moderately.
 3. No laminated, wet / hot bent square **balsa** strip or otherwise "formed" curved **balsa** tips.
 4. Wet / hot bent or "formed" **bamboo** tips are O.K.
 5. Sheet wood may be substituted for bamboo tips called for on some traditional dimer plans.
 6. No sliced or cracked ribs.
 7. No under cambered wings unless shown on original era plan.
- D. Dihedral (Traditional and Pseudo):
 1. 1" max per side for models with less than 14" W/S.
 2. 1.5" max per side for models with 14" to 16" W/S.
- E. Coverings:
 1. Double covering required unless original era plan specifically states "single covering."
 2. Single covering OK if original era kit supplied just one set of wing insignias or markings.
- F. Color and markings: Any color and markings on an original era plan may be changed to another era-appropriate combination.

3.0 STATIC JUDGING / BONUS POINTS / SCORING

- A. Models will be "judged" solely for fidelity to plan, both in construction and scale detail. If a detail is on the plan, it must be on the model.
- B. Dimers are not to be held to the same standards of scale fidelity or craftsmanship as FAC Scale models. No scale points are awarded. "Judging" is strictly pass/fail, according to rule "A" above.
- C. Bonus points: cumulative when model meets multiple criteria.

2	Compound curved / bubble canopy from clear flat sheet material, i.e. P-51D
3	Parasol
5	Mid-Wing

10	Float Plane
15	Biplane
20	Triplane
20	Multi-Engine

- D. Flight Score: Combined total of 3 official flights.
- E. Total Score: bonus points added once to total flight score.

OCTOBER MEETING MINUTES

President David Barfield called the October meeting to order at 12:30 pm. The meeting was held during the regularly scheduled flying session on October 23 at the North Georgia Turf Farm with ten members present.

Treasurer's Report

Don Brown reported that the balance on hand at the beginning of the reporting period, September 23, was \$X,XXX.XX. The deposit from the two-day September contest was \$160.00, and an additional \$20 came from the dues of a new member. With a total deposit sum of \$180.00, the balance on hand at the end of the reporting period, October 20, was \$X,XXX.XX. Jim Altenbern made a motion to accept the report as presented and Al Pardue gave a second. The motion passed unanimously.

Secretary's Report

David Mills made a motion to accept the minutes from the September meeting as published in the TTOMA newsletter. Jim Altenbern seconded the motion and the membership voted unanimously to support the motion.

Old Business

Jim Altenbern asked if the TTOMA contribution check to the NFFS Scholarship Fund had been accounted for by the NFFS staff. At this point, the check has not been located and a replacement check will be issued. David Mills volunteered to check with NFFS.

David Barfield reported that FAC Headquarters has given an OK for kanones to be earned when flying the club 2012 Stahl model of the year event.

New Business

David Mills recommended that Dime Scale be made the club Event of the Year (EOY). Howard seconded the motion and the motion was approved.

David Mills reminded everyone that a slate of officers for next year needs to be before the group for vote at the November meeting. All the current officers agreed to stay on in 2012.

David Mills reported that a Category I indoor record trials will be scheduled for November 19 at the gymnasium of St Luke's Presbyterian Church. Time keepers will be needed to support this effort, and it is expected that this event will draw some out-of-town interest.

The subject of the next banquet was discussed, and everyone was in favor of returning to the Petit Auberge location used last year. Dohrman Crawford will contact the restaurant with the objective of setting a date for the last Saturday in January.

Dohrman Crawford stated that he indoor flying schedule for the coming winter will be set as soon as a list of Contest Directors is available to manage the effort.

Don Brown suggested that since the club financial situation is so good that we might reduce dues. No action was taken on this point as most of those present felt that retaining the \$20 annual fee helped give the club options for activities that come up. Bob Thoren suggested that more cash prizes be offered in the coming 2012 season. These subjects will be discussed again.

Dohrman Crawford made a motion to contribute \$400 to the funds to be used for travel for Nick Ray who is a member of the US Indoor Team scheduled to fly in the World Championships in Serbia next year. Graham Selick seconded the motion, and the members voted to support the

idea. Meanwhile, David Mills will talk to Nick to see how funds are accumulated to support the team travel. When that fact is known, a final decision will be made about the contribution.

Bob Thoren announced that the annual Winter Coupe contest in Pensacola is scheduled for February 18 and 19, 2012. The Huntsville Model Airplane Club has sponsored the contest for many years, but only two members of the Huntsville MAC are still active. Consequently, the Pensacola Free Flight Team has agreed to continue the contest.

Dohrman Crawford made a motion to adjourn the meeting as there was no further business to transact. Graham Selick gave a second and the meeting was adjourned at 1:15 pm. Respectfully submitted by Karl Hube, secretary.

NOVEMBER MEETING MINUTES

The November meeting of the TTOMA was held on November 6 during the Turkey Shoot Contest of outdoor flying at the North Georgia Turf Farm. Seven members were in attendance and the meeting convened at 12:00 noon.

Treasurer's Report

Don Brown's financial data showed that the beginning balance on October 20, 2011 was \$X,XXX.XX. During the reporting period, there was one deposit for \$30.00 generated by fees from the October indoor fun fly. No expenses were incurred, and the closing balance was \$X,XXX.XX. David Mills made a motion to accept the report as presented and the vote was unanimous.

Secretary's Report

David Mills made a motion that the minutes from the October meeting as published in the newsletter be accepted. No comments or changes were requested and the vote of support was unanimous.

Old Business

During the October meeting, all the current officers volunteered to stay on to serve in 2012. There was no objection to the offer and the current officers were then put on the 2012 election slate. Candidates were President ~ David barfield, Vice President ~ Jim Altenbern, Treasurer ~ Don Brown, and Secretary ~ Karl Hube. The member vote was unanimous for the slate and all officers will remain in office for 2012.

David Barfield reminded everyone about renewing their memberships for next year and that the winter banquet was coming up in late January. David Mills mentioned the banquet flyer with RSVP form would be appearing in the last newsletter of the year around Christmas.

There being no additional business to conduct, the meeting was adjourned at 12:35 pm. Respectfully submitted by Karl Hube, secretary.
